BIO SECURITY

The Organisers of the Welsh Dairy Show confirm that they will undertake to comply with all rules and conditions and obtain the necessary licence to hold Livestock Sections in accordance with the Orders and Regulations of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) and the National Assembly for Wales Agricultural Department (NAWAD) including the Animal Gatherings (Wales) Order 2007, appertaining at the time of the Show. The Committee has adopted DEFRA's motto of 'Remember Be Seen to be Clean' and asks the public and exhibitors to give their full co-operation.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Special attention is directed to the safety requirements set out in the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and any subsequent legislation. The Society holds exhibitors wholly responsible for the observance of statutory regulations governing livestock and other exhibits by them.

All exhibitors are accepted for adjudication on the understanding that they are capable of complying with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and the regulations which come under that Act. Failure to comply with the statutory regulations will mean that the exhibitor will be asked to remove his /her exhibit from the showground. Persons are admitted to the Showground at their own risk and every endeavour is taken to ensure their safety. The Society will not (save for death or personal injury caused by negligence of the Society, its servants or agents) be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise), loss or damage to property and any other loss, damage, costs and expenses, however caused.

Persons are admitted entry to the Showground Vehicle Parks at their own risk and vehicles, their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the Show ground Vehicle Parks at the owner's risk. While every endeavour is taken to ensure the safety thereof, the Society will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Society, its servants or agents) be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise) loss or damage to property and any other loss of, damage, cost and expenses however caused.

The Society, its officers or servants, shall not be responsible for any person whatsoever while upon the Society's premises, or leaving the same, for any damage or loss, however caused, to the property of any such person, or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person.

The Society, its officers or servants, shall not be responsible for any accidents, damage or loss, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitors animal, articles or property brought to the Showground, or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the said Showground.

Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought onto the Showground by him/her and he / she shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.

It is recommended that all exhibitors insure against such liabilities as they may incur under these regulations.

- b. Records for the last two consecutive lactations will be taken into consideration.
- c. Points will be awarded for the interval between the calving date of the first of these two lactations to the dry date of the second of these two lactations. A scale of plus 5 points for each day under 800, minus 5 points for each day over 800.
- d. Points for production will be allocated in class.
 - Total kilos of fat for both lactations - 3 points for each kilo.
 - Total kilos of protein for both lactations - 4 points for each kilo.
- e. These points will be weighted to the National Milk Records average at October 2021 for each of the breeds with each breed being brought to a common denominator.
- f. **Exhibitor Bred** - 500 points will be awarded to any Entry bred by the Exhibitor
- g. **Inspection Points** - awarded by the judge on a scale of points with the highest placed animal on inspection receiving the number of points achieved by the highest placed animal in the production section with the remainder of the class being allocated at the judge's discretion.

THANKS.

1. Rules of the Welsh Dairy Show

The Show is held and organised under the Constitution and Bye-Laws of the United Counties Agricultural & Hunters Society. The conditions applicable to the Dairy Show are:

1. All Entries shall be made to the Show Secretary on the Certificate of Entry provided for the purpose. No Entry whatsoever shall be accepted unless accompanied by all entry fees due.
2. All Animals entered for exhibition must be registered in the Herd Book proper or the Supplementary Register of their respective Breed Society. All Breed Certificates and Passports must be available for inspection by the Stewards on arrival and during duration of the Show.
3. The Society reserve to themselves the right of accepting or rejecting any Entry, to cancel any Class or Trade Stand, and to expel any person from the Showground.
4. Any Member being detected in any attempt to impose upon the Society shall forfeit all Prizes that may be or may become due to him, and be expelled from the Society.
5. Every Exhibitor will be held responsible for the correctness of his Certificate of Entry.
6. No Prize will be given when the Judges consider there is not sufficient merit to justify an award.
7. The Owners or Servants in charge of stock must see that they are properly placed and secured in the place allotted to them and that the number on the ticket corresponds with the area in which they are placed, and those in charge of stock are particularly requested not to leave at any time during the Show, the stock which they have in their charge.
8. The Society, it's Officers and Servants, will not be responsible for any errors or mistakes that may be made in placing, or securing the stock.
9. In-Calf Heifers must calve within six months of the Exhibition. All In-Calf Heifers must be under three years of age at time of Exhibition and at the Date of expected Calving. All In-Milk Heifers must be under three years of age at Date of Calving. All Cows shown in In-Calf Classes must calve within four months of the Date of Exhibition. Prize Money may be withheld on all In Calf Classes until Entry has been certified as Calved to the satisfaction of the Committee.
10. No animal shall be eligible to compete in any other Class except in the case of Challenge Cups, Champion and Special prizes to include the Milk Recorded classes.
11. Objection to any Animal which has been awarded any Prize, Medal or Cup or to the Owner of any Animal, whether on the ground of ineligibility to compete, or on any other ground, must be made in writing to the Secretary within ONE HOUR of the completion of Breed Judging, stating the grounds on which the objection is made, and any person lodging an objection must deposit £100 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited if the objection is over-ruled.
- 12.. All objections and questions of dispute shall be referred to the Dairy Show Disputes Committee, comprising of the Chief Steward, Deputy Chief Steward and the Vice Chairman of the Show committee. Its decision shall be final, and from which there shall be no appeal, legal or otherwise.
 - 13 The Stewards will be requested to pay attention that no one is allowed to stand In the Ring during judging, unless he is in charge of an Animal which is being Exhibited in the Class, and if any person is found hindering the Judges or Stewards in their official capacity, he will at once be liable to be removed from the Showground.
14. All Owners or Servants in charge of Stock will be subject to the order of the Stewards and any Servant or Owner disobeying such orders will be liable to be fined or expelled from the Showground.
15. No placards or advertisements of any sort will be allowed to be fixed on any of the Society's plant or premises without the consent of the Show Secretary.

16. 3 or less exhibitor or 8 exhibit or less animals the class will be amalgamated with a other section with the lowest number of entries the decision will be made on closing date by The Chief Steward.
17. In the event of 12 or more Entries per Class being exhibited then the Class will be split and the same Prize Money allocated.
18. All Challenge Cups to be won three times before becoming the property of the Owner.
19. The Society prohibits the use of electrical appliances for Clipping and Drying in designated area only in the interests of safety under the Regulations published for safety at Agricultural Shows. Only battery operated clippers may be used (by directive of the Health & Safety Executive).
22. All Cattle Handlers to be dressed in accordance with the appropriate Breed Society Dress Regulations.
23. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED IN ANY SECTION.
23. Exhibitor Bred - Open to all Exhibitors who solely own and bred the animal exhibited.
24. The decision of the Chief Steward on any matter relating to the rules of the Welsh Dairy Show, whether or not provided for herein, will final and binding on all competitors.
26. Any artificial contrivance or device of any description found on, or proved to have been used on an animals, at any time whilst that animal is on the showground, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper practice to alter the natural state of the animal, the matter will be put to the Dairy Show Disciplinary panel.
